Dayton 9803

This well-travelled trolleybus was on the move again in November. It left Prague Museum of Public Transport on 16 November and was taken to Bratislava after Československý Dopravák magazine was approached by a company that specialises in the production of 3D models that can be used in the film industry, computer games, virtual reality, etc. Unfortunately it was not possible to run the vehicle on the Bratislava trolleybus network while it was there.

The work took about a fortnight and then at the end of November 9803 was transported from Bratislava to its new home at the museum in Strašice, near Plzeň. This museum is privately run and has featured in *Trolleybus* several times. It had a relatively successful season in 2020 despite having to cancel some of the planned open weekends. The next scheduled opening is at Easter, when the public will have its first opportunity to see 9803 in its new home.
